Who Qualifies?

- People of any age
- People with a diagnosis of an intellectual disability as defined by state law or who have a diagnosis of a related condition with an IQ of 75 or below
- Participants CANNOT be enrolled in another waiver program



Home and Community Services (HCS) is a state sponsored program that provides individualized services and supports to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Support is available in a variety of residential settings including: adults living independent living, living with family members, or in other options such as small group homes where no more than four individuals live together. Mission Road helps people with IDD live as independently, productively, and included in the community as possible.

We maintain a team of compassionate nurses, program managers, and program coordinators to implement support services and monitor your loved one's care. The HCS program provides a menu of services from which families or individual clients can pick and choose, based on their own unique needs.

Our Host Home Companion Care Program is a Residential Services option. In this program, families are paid to provide residential services in their homes for up to three adults with IDD. To qualify, you must first complete a Mission Road application and pass a criminal background check. Your home must then be inspected for safety by the Fire Marshall and Mission Road staff. If approved, Mission Road will provide families with free CPR and First Aid training at our campus training center. You can be paid to provide this service for your own adult child, a family member, or a non-relative. For more information, call Elisa Gonzalez at (210) 241-4867

Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with IDD



Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF) provides residential and habilitation services to people with intellectual disabilities. The State of Texas is phasing out this program. There has not been new funding for ICF licenses for several years. Mission Road, however, continues to maintain four residential ICF licenses.

ICF-IDD is a Medicaid entitlement program that provides residential and other support services for adults with IDD.

Residential services are provided in group home settings that are located within the community. The number of people served in Mission Road ICF group homes ranges from 6 to 12 people. Mission Road helps people with IDD live as independently, productively, and included in the community as possible.

In addition to residential needs, the ICF program provides a variety of support services based on an individual's needs. Mission Road maintains a compassionate team of professionals who develop and implement a program of services and care designed specifically for each individual. ICF residential services are often more immediately available to qualified individuals well before they are granted similar residential services through the Home and Community-Based Services (HCS) program.
