When she came to MRDC, she was ready to pursue her work goals and was paired up with a Job Coach, Mrs. Bea Valdez, after her VAT completion. Mrs. Bea assisted Alyssa with her job search activities, and after one interview, Alyssa got a job! She is now working as an H-E-B Curbside team member. We are sure Alyssa will be very successful because of everything she learned during her work readiness courses and working with Mrs. Bea.

Raquel Armendariz came to us in February. She had previously held a job for five years, but was ready for something new. When asked about her reasons for wanting a new job, Raquel mentioned that her previous place of work had hired a new manager. She expressed that her hours became shorter and shorter and her manager began giving her tasks that she had never been given before. She decided that it was time for a change. Job Coach Thomas Vasquez assisted her in finding a job at Raising Cane's where she is now happy with the management who understands the accommodations Raquel needs to do the best job she possibly can. Thomas has been providing her with job coaching as she continues to learn her new job duties and becomes independent in her role.

Fatima Chavez (pictured above far right) came from El Salvador, where she directed a pottery business for many years before coming to the U.S. After months of difficulty securing employment, Fatima signed up for MRDC's services. Fatima believed she wasn't receiving job offers because employers were worried about accommodating her needs due to her wheelchair. She'd encountered many obstacles and challenges job searching on her own, but Fatima's job coach, Mrs. Bea, knew she was capable! Mrs. Bea stayed focused and helped Fatima find the perfect placement at Toyota in its ToyotAbility Program. Toyota's program gives people with IDD and other disabilities opportunities to work and improve their skills while earning income. Fatima is now happily working and her persistence, hard work, and skills are paying off!

Hello family and friends,


